



Homonym, Homophone and Homograph

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Homophone

- ‘Homo’ means ‘Same’
- ‘Phone’ means ‘Sound’

Explanation

- Different Spelling
- Different Meaning
- Same pronunciation

Examples

Hear and Here, Gate and Get, Site and Sight, Seen and Scene, etc.

Homonym

- ‘Homo’ means ‘Same’
- ‘Nym’ means ‘Name’

Explanation

- Same Spelling
- Same Pronunciation
- Different Meaning

Examples

- Cricket and Cricket, Rose and Rose, Pole and Pole, Bat and Bat etc.

- ❑ The bear cannot bear the beer. [Homophone and Homonym]



Homograph

- ‘Homo’ means ‘Same’
- ‘Graph’ means ‘Writing’

Explanation

- Different Pronunciation
- Different Meaning
- Same Spelling

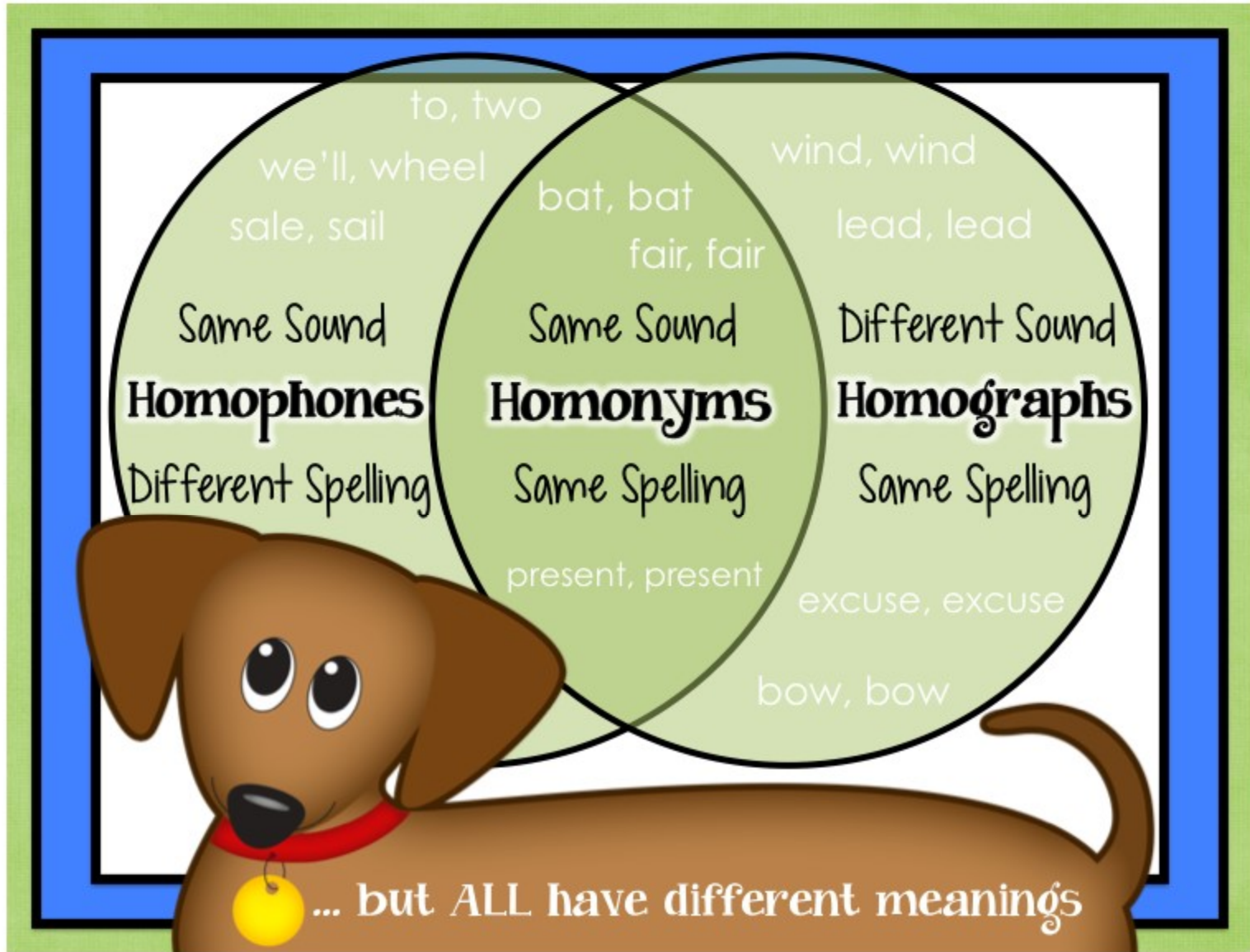
Examples

Excuse: (verb, [s] sounds like /z/)

Excuse: (noun, [s] sounds like /s/)

OBject: (noun) a thing

obJECT: (verb) to voice disagreement
